

Warden Training

The Warden course is designed to provide participants with the skill, knowledge and experience to perform the duties of a Warden and Floor or Area Warden. It provides knowledge in using human behaviour characteristics during the stressful times associated with an emergency, information on workplace emergency systems operation and communication needs to safely and effectively deal with workplace emergencies.

Australian Standard 3745 recommends that the Emergency Control Organization participate in a skills retention activity every 6 months. Participation on the Warden training will assist in compliance with this Standard.

Nationally Recognised Training

On successful completion of this course, students will be issued with a nationally recognised Statement of Attainment for:



- PUAWER002B Ensure workplace emergency prevention procedures, systems and processes are implemented
- PUAWER005B Operate as part of an emergency control organisation

Duration and Location

This course is delivered over 3 hours. Warden Training can be delivered at your premises or at a Chubb training facility.

Content

- Ensure workplace emergency prevention processes are implemented
- Ensure appropriate hazard analysis is undertaken and results are implemented
- Ensure workplace emergency protection systems, emergency control equipment and evacuation systems remain effective
- Respond to emergency reports, signals and warnings
- Initiate and control initial emergency response
- Anticipate the further development of emergencies
- Assist with post initial response



Course Participation

This course is limited to a maximum of 15 participants.

Participants require the following for the course:

- Photo identification
- Copy / knowledge of their workplace emergency response manual/ procedures
- Their warden identification marker(s) – for example the red or yellow helmet, vest, or similar
- Any checklists for their area or floor

Language, Literacy and Numeracy

Participants are required to understand the main ideas in documents such as safety data sheets or an emergency plan, write at least one paragraph and participate in basic oral communication to successfully complete this course.

You will be assessed with a combination of short answer written questions and practical activities.
